# 2019 FHWA Retirees Reunion scheduled for the Chicago area

The 32<sup>st</sup> Annual FHWA Retirees Reunion Host Committee has been working hard this past year to pull together some great tours and expose the retirees to the fun side of the Chicago area. We selected the Hyatt Regency Hotel in Schaumburg, Illinois, as our host hotel and were able to secure a room rate of \$105 per night plus tax (15% tax for a total room cost of \$120.75) for up to four occupants and include a buffet breakfast for two. That's a phenomenal rate for a classy hotel in the Chicago area! And that rate is available for three days before our reunion dates (May 29 to June 2, 2019.) So you could come for the Memorial Day Weekend before or stay for a few days after the reunion and really do the city! We surveyed last year's attendees in Clearwater and the top requests were to take a tour of the Chicago architecture, visit the well-known Navy Pier, and peruse some world-class museums and parks. There was also a lot of interest in taking a tour of the haunts frequented by Chicago's gangsters and hear their stories as well as attending a major league game. Although we have limited time, we will try to squeeze in as much as we can on our Friday tour and plan to provide information and contacts for you to easily pursue the others that are of most interest to you on your own. As in the past, our target is to have the reunion package out to you in mid-January, 2019. Reservations will be due by March 1<sup>st</sup> in order for us to complete the arrangements for your awesome visit!

As at past reunions, we will: schedule a round of golf on Thursday morning for those who choose to participate; conduct our silent auction of donated items; host a welcome reception on Thursday evening; hold a final banquet on Saturday evening; and, host a hospitality suite for all to enjoy while catching up with friends in their free time. The hotel is excellent and very well suited to our needs with almost 500 sleeping rooms, both indoor and outdoor pools, many intimate corners for small group discussions, a huge hospitality suite for our exclusive use, several eating establishments on site, and one of the biggest shopping areas in the country across the street! The hotel also has onsite car rentals and bike rentals, a forest preserve of over 3500 acres less than a mile away, free on-site parking, free shuttle service within a five mile radius, and complimentary Wi-Fi.
